Who are we?

Interweave Continental was

founded in the early 1970s as "Unitarian Universalists for Gay Concerns" as a grassroots support network for sexual minorities within the Unitarian Universalist Association. Over time the organization evolved to include bisexual and transgender people in addition to gays and lesbians, lobbied successfully for the creation of the Office of Bisexual, Gay, Lesbian and Transgender Concerns, and helped secure the passage of several General Assembly resolutions advocating for the rights of BGLT people.

Ten years ago, Interweave Continental decided to include a category of Chapter membership in addition to individual membership to recognize the importance of congregational and district groups who were providing the same advocacy and support to the BGLT community as the continental organization.

Over time, the concept of a Chapter and how it fits into the larger organization has evolved. Many congregations have BGLT support groups who call themselves "Interweave" who have no relationship with Interweave Continental. Still many other congregations do have BGLT groups who affiliate with us as Chapters, understanding that there is strength and support in numbers.

It's your choice, but we encourage you to affiliate. Check out the benefits on the facing panel!
